### SESSION CLERK'S VACANCY UPDATE

I am pleased to be able to report that the congregation has been granted permission from Presbytery to call a new minister on an unrestricted tenure. The Kirk Session now requires to finalise the Electoral Register which lists all those people eligible to vote during the vacancy process.

A Parish Profile needs to be prepared so that a prospective minister has information about our church and Parish and the elders must also have a discussion and vote on whether or not we will consider applications from ministers in civil partnerships and same-sex marriages.

The search for a new minister will be undertaken by a Nominating Committee elected by the congregation. It is likely to be mid-late January before we are ready to hold the election but all members are invited to consider whether they would wish to stand for election to this Committee. It is important that we have a good cross-section of our church family represented on it.






